ANNUAL REPORT.

The Committee have pleasure in presenting the ANNUAL REPORT AND BALANCE SHEET for 1935.

Our ninety-ninth annual show was held at the Whinney Moor Hotel, Lupset, now the society's headquarters, which is in a large and growing garden suburb of the city.

Years ago Eastmoor was a stronghold of Tulip Culture but now the tide has turned towards Lupset and the neighbouring township of Horbury. It must not be inferred from this however that the society is dependent on one area alone, for there are exhibitors from as far away as Cheshire and Lancashire and in this neighbourhood Normanton and Altofts have worthy representatives.

We regret to report the death of our esteemed President, Mr. C. W. Needham, who for the past 40 years has been a familiar figure at our shows. His great work for the Society and love of the Tulip severs yet another link of the old Florist Fancy.

We desire to place on record the invaluable services rendered to this Society by our late President.

It is with delight that the society have for this, our Centenary Show, Sir Danial Hall K.C.B., as President.

Sir Danial Hall is noted for his scientific activities for the Ministry of Agriculture, and his keen research work on the Tulip. His book "The Tulip" is a very valuable work in the florist world.

We regret the winding-up of the National Tulip Society, "the stronghold of the south" which leaves us the only Florist Tulip Society in the British Isles.

The winner in this class holds the Silver Challenge Cup for eleven months only, when it must be returned to the Secretary, carriage paid and in good order.

Class 2.—Pan of 6 Rectified (dissimilar).

Class 3.—6 Breeders (dissimilar).

Class 4.—Pair of Flamed (any class). Class 5.—Pair of Feathered (any class).

Class 6.—Best Vase of 9 English Florist Tulips, foliage allowed. Staged for quality and effect.

Special Prize of 6 Tea and 2 Tablespoons given by Messrs. F. K. Perkins, Jewellers, Wakefield, to Exhibitor scoring most points in Open Class.

Class 7.—Best Vase of twenty-five English Florist Tulips to be staged with long stems and only own foliage allowed. Vases provided.

All entries in class 7 to become the property of the Society and will be sold at a time selected by the Committee. Proceeds for Society Funds.

Class 8.—Needham Memorial Class.

Three Bizarres, 1 Breeder, 1 Feathered, 1 Flamed.

For this class we offer a valuable Trophy suitably inscribed and open to all exhibitors, to be held for 11 months only and then returned to the Secretary.

Minimum Subscription for Exhibitors in Open Classes is 5/- per year, to be paid on or before May 30th. All blooms must be staged by 12 noon. Exhibitors who cannot bring their flowers may send them to the Whinney Moor Hotel, Lupset, nr. Wakefield, and the Committee will gladly stage them. Please advise Secretary a few days before Show.

In Class 6, the Entrance Fee is 6d. only. Prizes: 7/6 First, 5/- Second and 2/6 Third.

For the Local Classes we offer the Silver Challenge Cup for the Best Stand of Nine Tulips. Cup to be held for eleven months only.

Class 9.—As Class 1. above.

Class 10.—Pan of 6 Rectified (dissimilar).

Class 11.—Pan of 6 Breeders (dissimilar).

Class 12.—Pan of 3 Breeders (dissimilar).

Class 13.—1 Breeder, 1 Flamed. 1 Feathered, must be of one colour i.e., all Bizarres, all Biblomens, or all Roses. Preference will be given to 3 blooms as above of the same name.

Class 14. to 22.—Single Bloom Classes, 9 in number. No Exhibitor to take more than one prize in each class.

Class 23.—For Novices, 1 Breeder, 1 Flamed, and 1 Feathered.
Hand Syringe and 4 lbs. insecticide give by Messrs. Cooper, MacDougall & Robertson, Ltd., to Exhibitor scoring most points in Local Classes.
