*Self Auriculas.*—1. Archdale's Berry's Lord Primate.—2. Ditto Berry's Lord Lee.—3. J. Robson's Mellor's Lord Howe.—4. J. Archdale's Redman's Metropolitan.

*Polyanthuses.*—1. Stead's Fillingham's Tantarara.—2. J. Archdale's Thompson's Nelson.—2d. J. Taylor's England's Defiance.—4. J. Archdale's Mount Pleasant.
